5. Are there situations in your life where you have faced adversity or setbacks in serving Christ? How can you respond with the same affirmation and encouragement that Paul showed toward Epaphroditus?
6. Consider the "cloud of witnesses" mentioned in Hebrews 12:1. What weights or sins are hindering you from running the race set before you with endurance? How can you lay these aside and pursue Christ's calling wholeheartedly?
